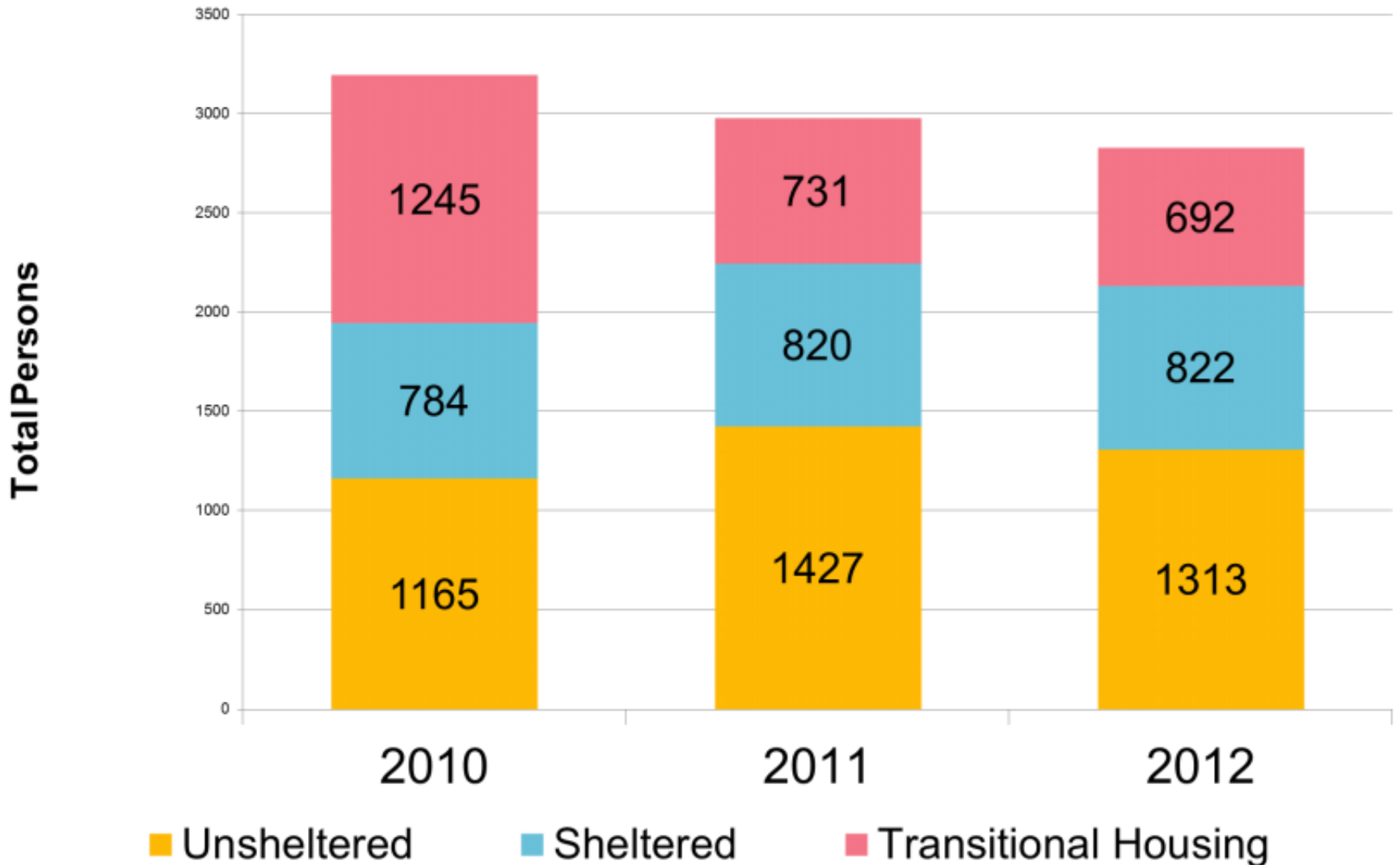

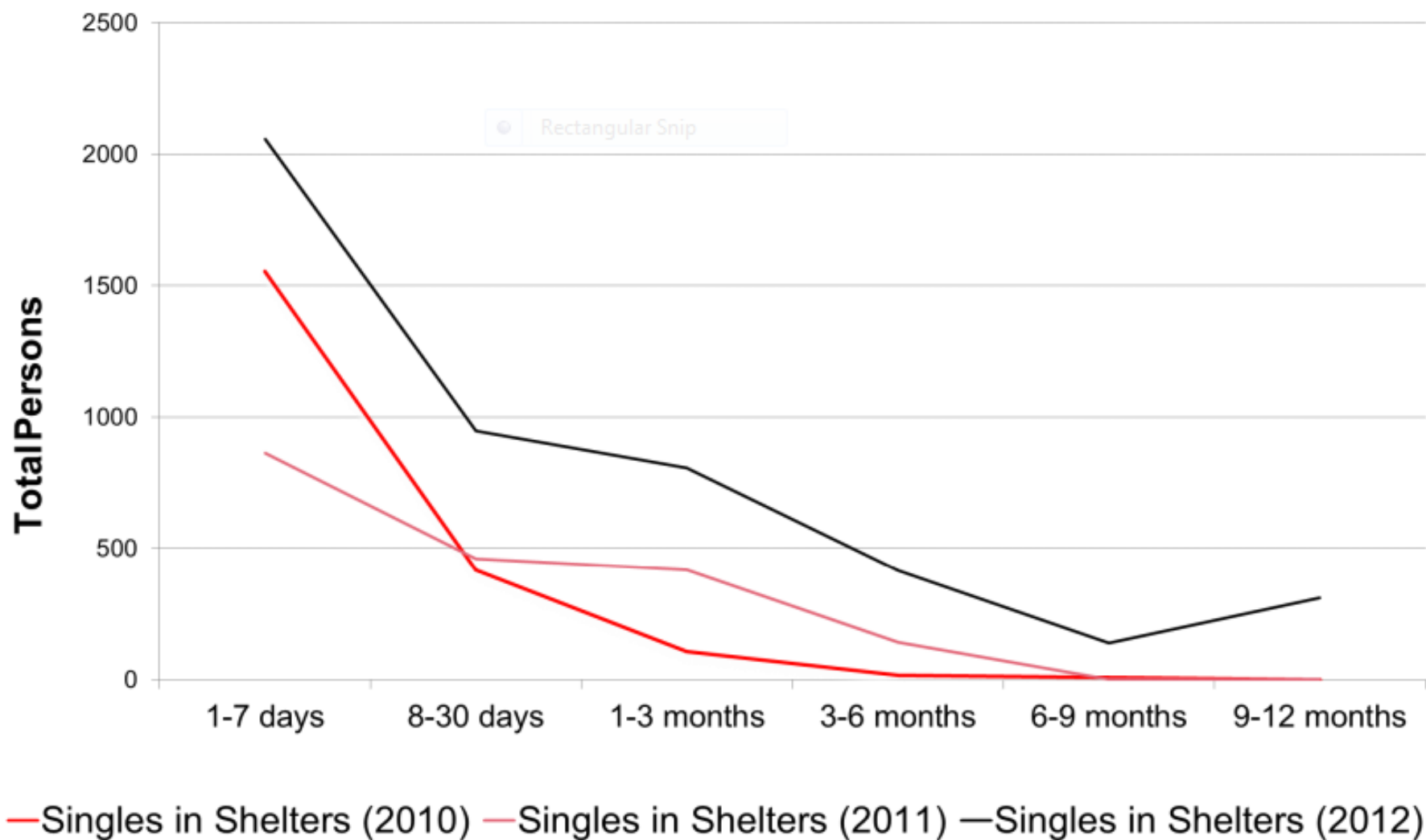

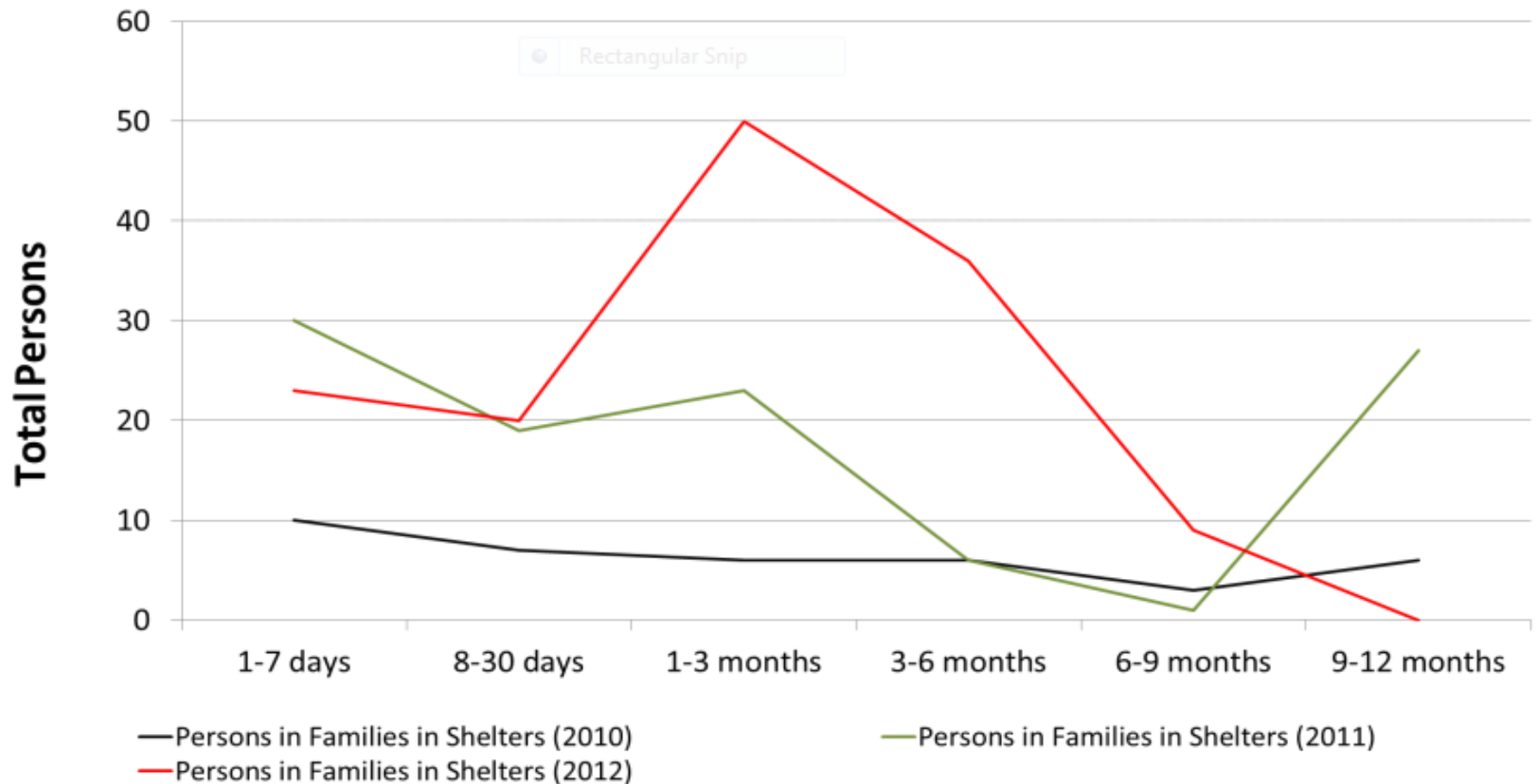
# Homeless Trends Point in Time Count



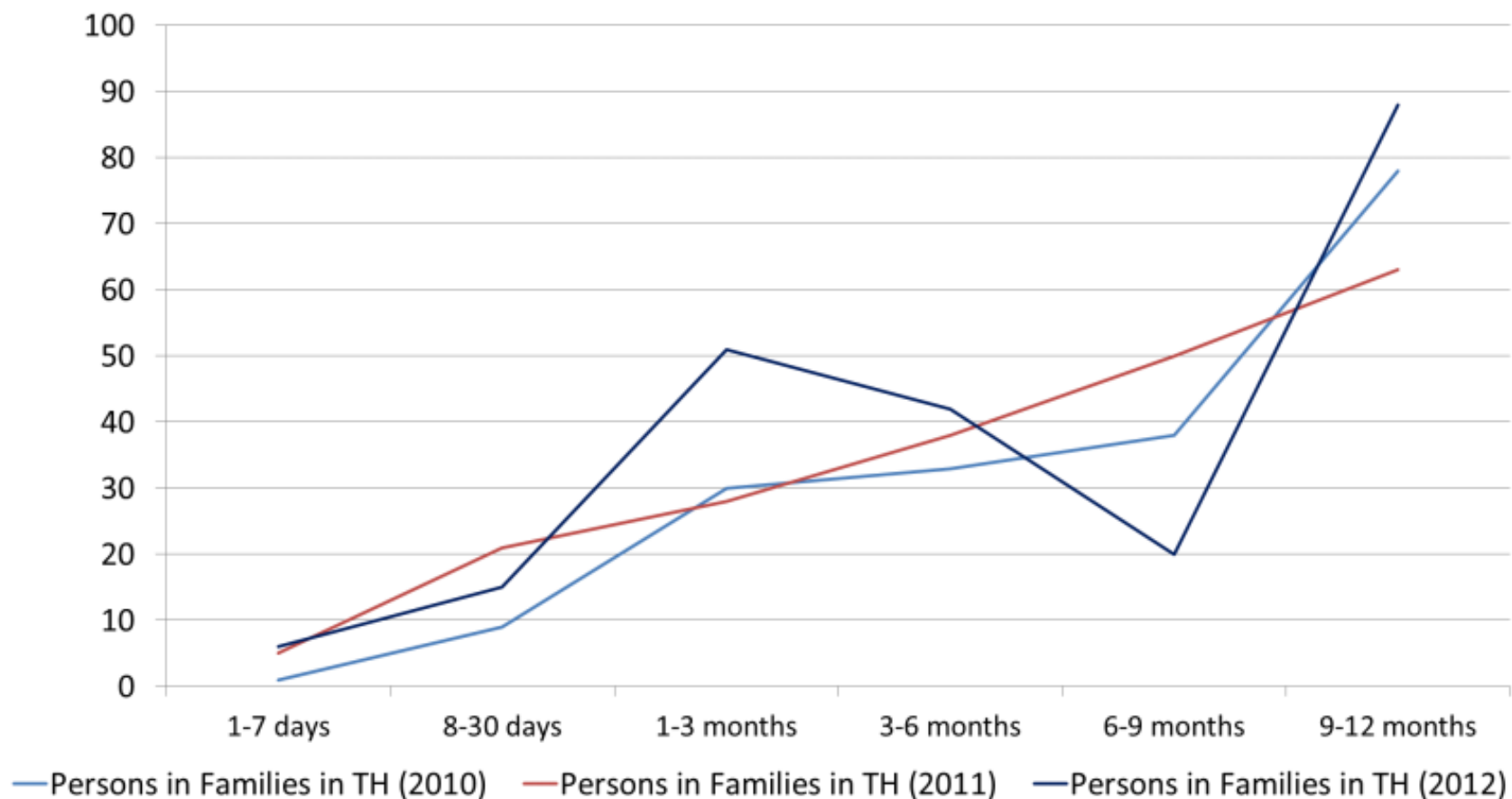
# Trends in Length of Stay Singles in Shelters



# Trends in Length of Stay Families in Shelters



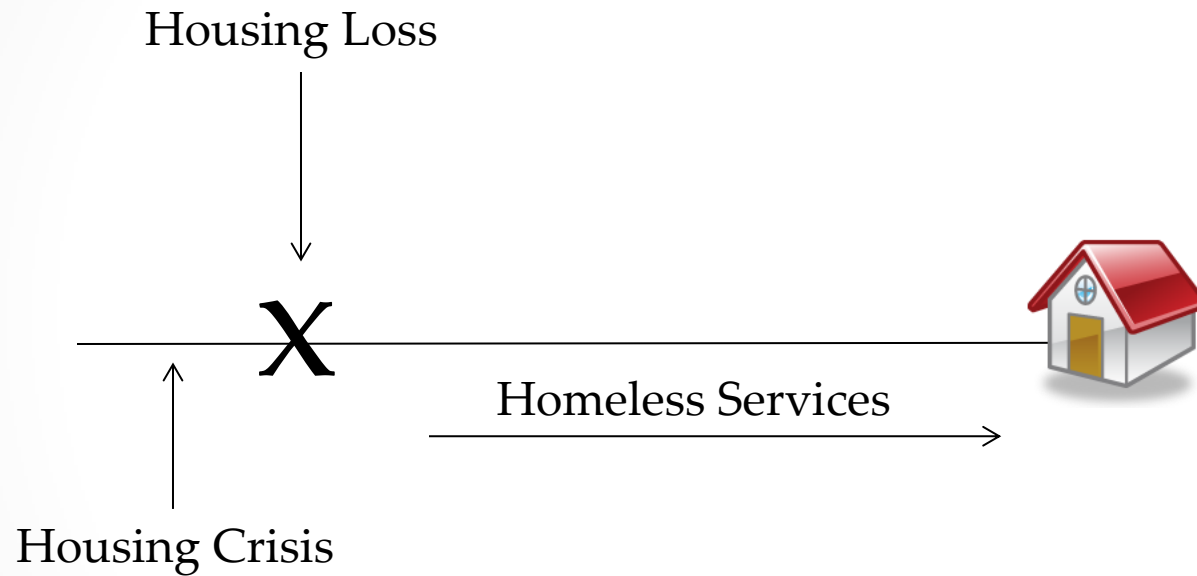
# Table 7E: Trends in Length of Stay Families in Transitional Housing



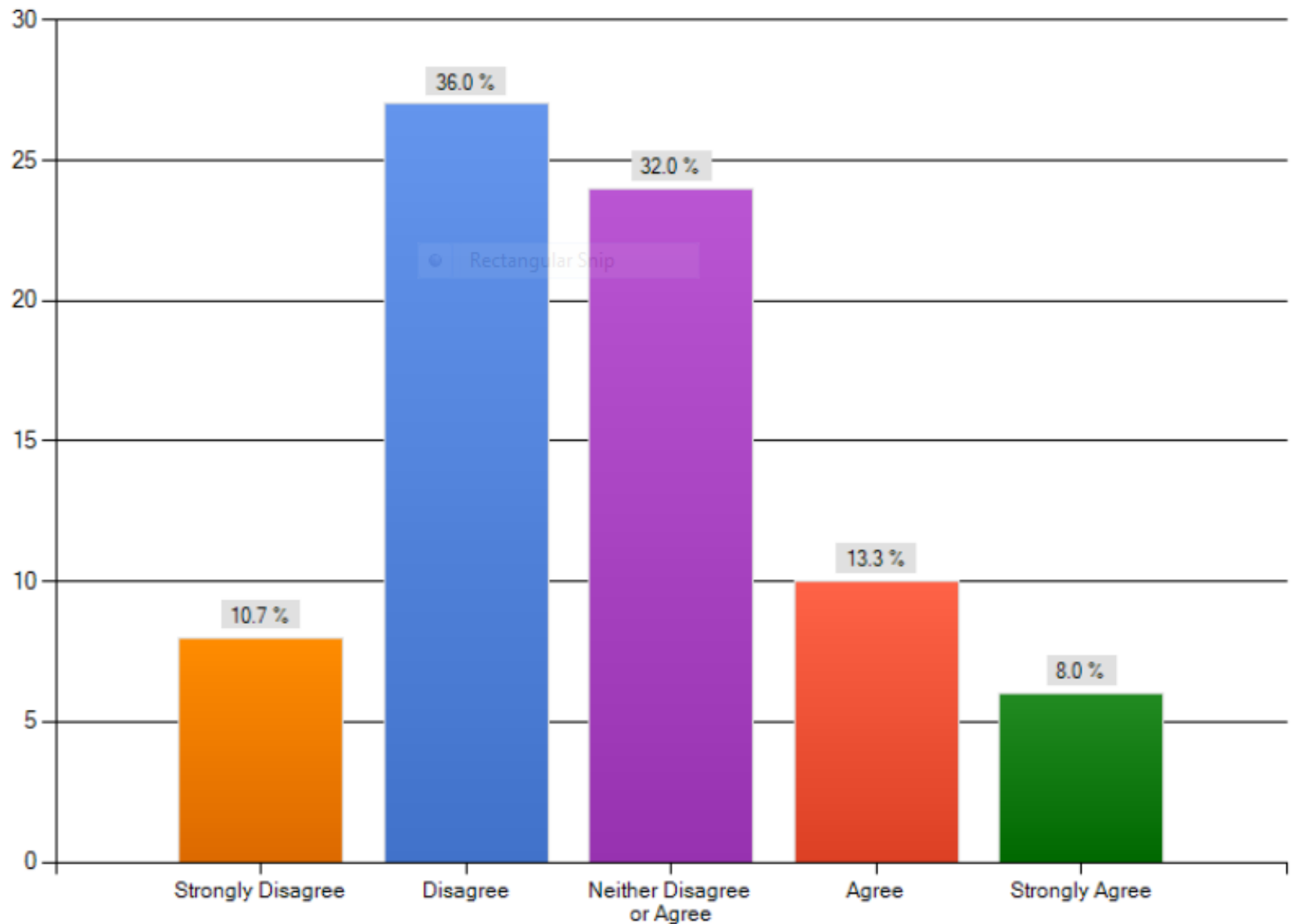
# Costs Per Exit



# Traditional Service Delivery Model

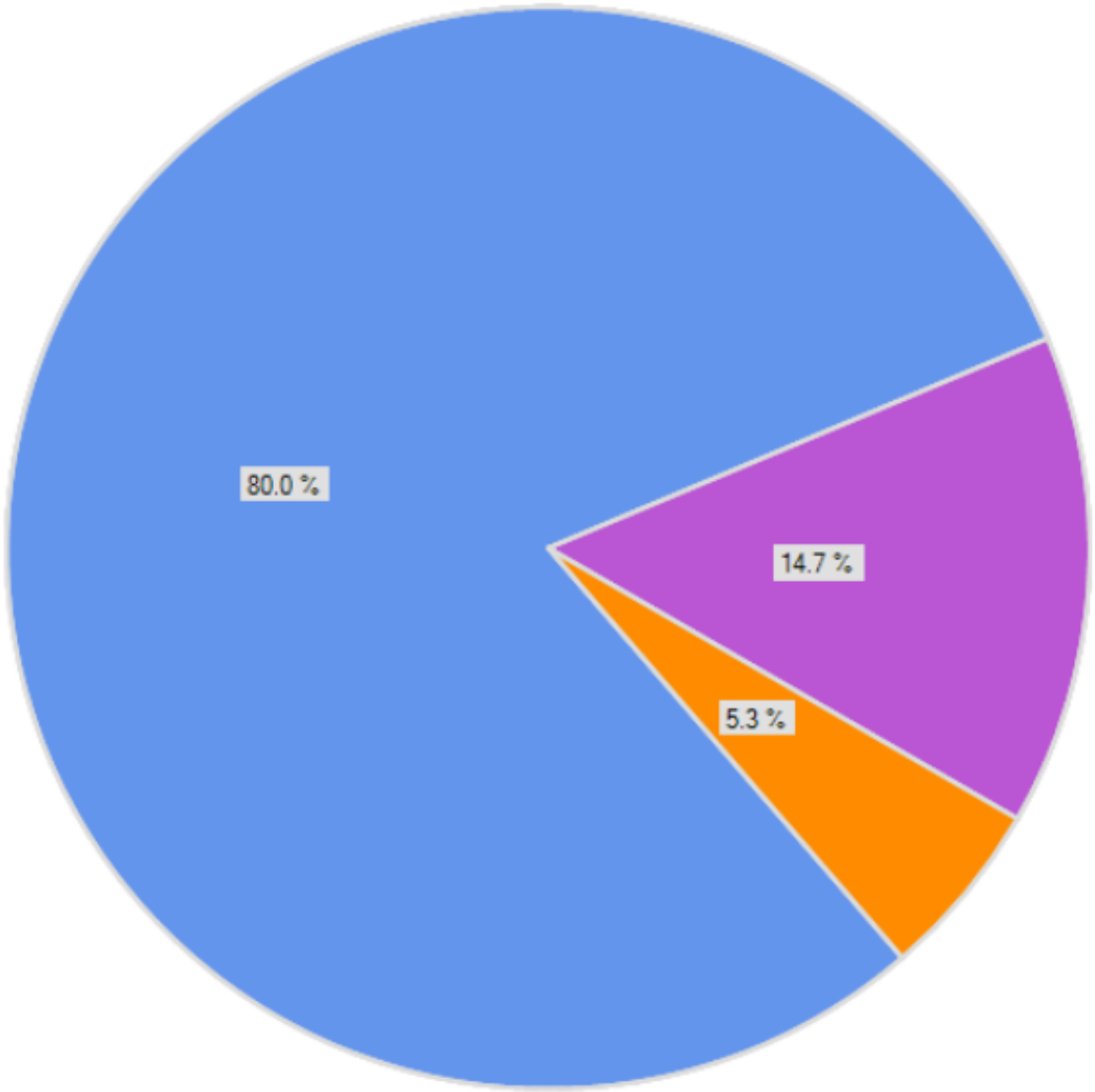

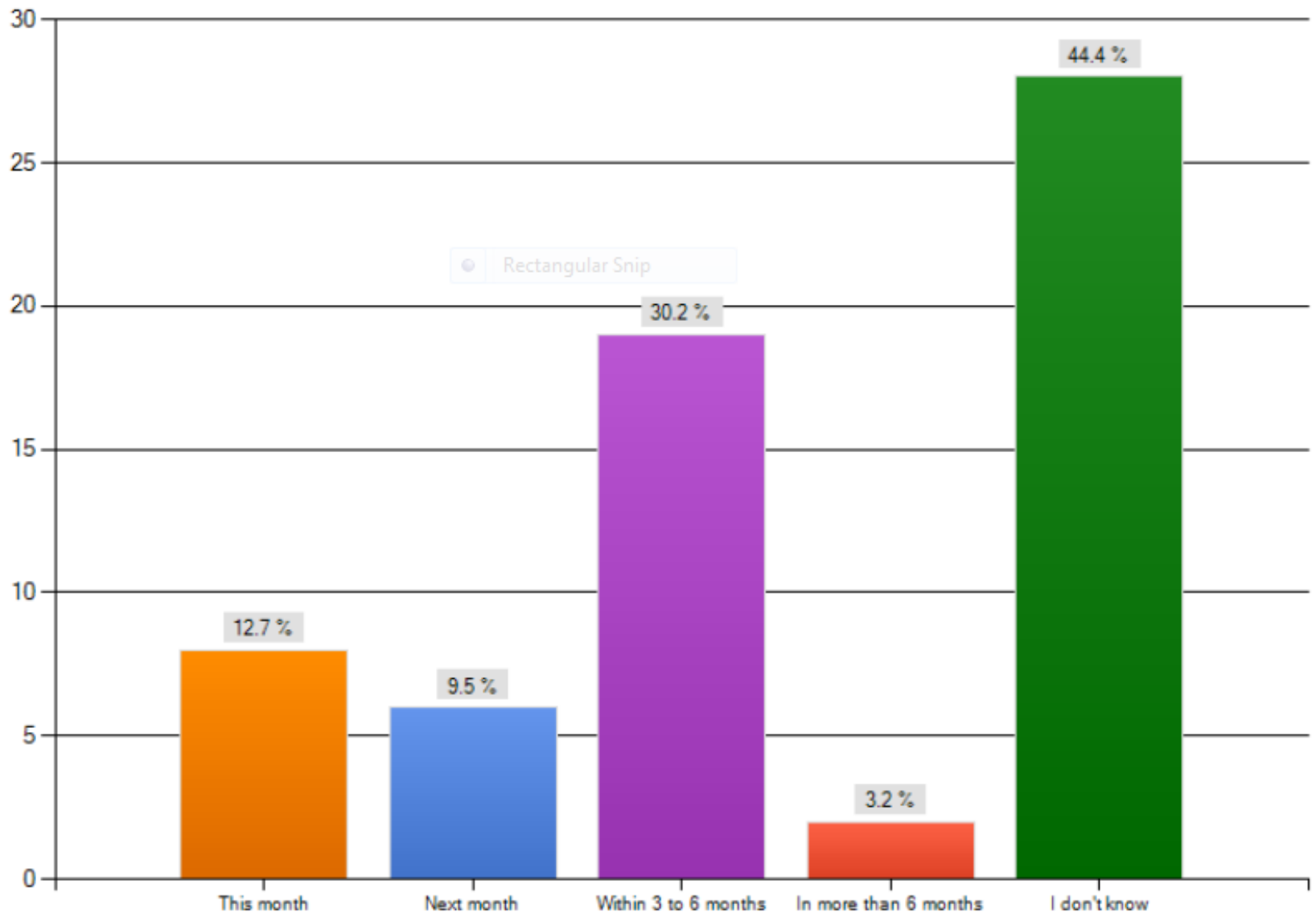


**Within your first 30 days of being homeless, were you placed into permanent housing?**

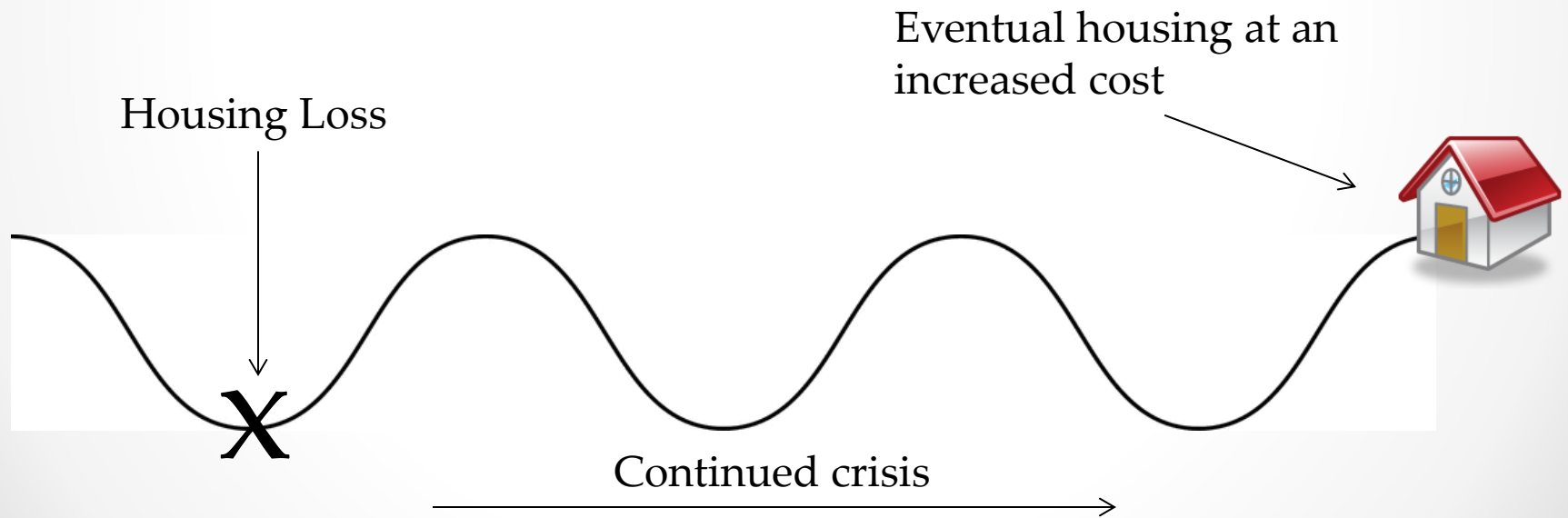

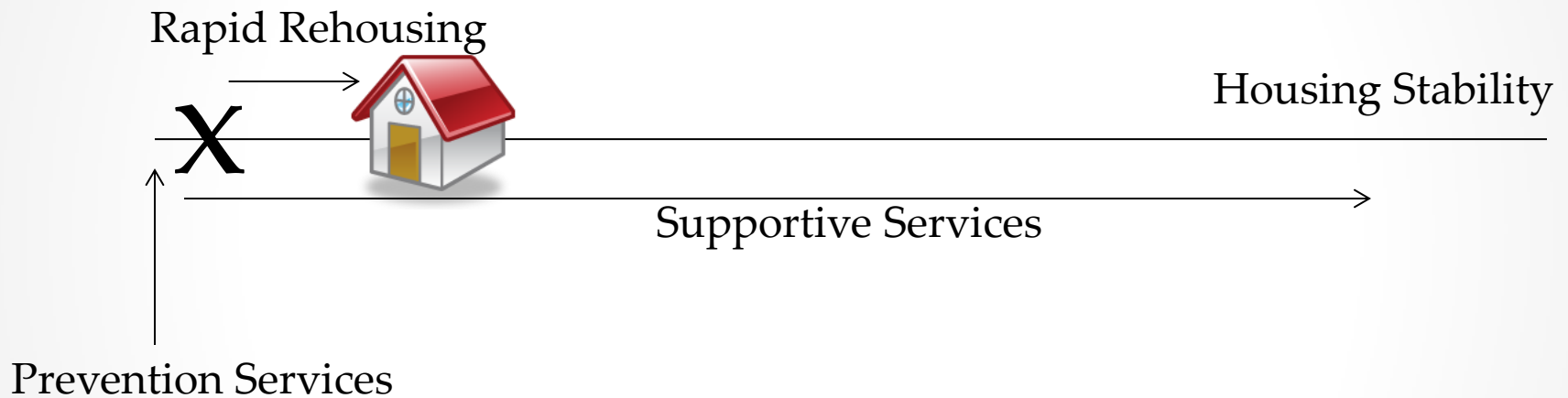
## If you are currently NOT housed, when do you expect to be housed?

# SSVF: Core Components

- Housing First Model
- Access to supportive services
  - Households demonstrating high needs
- Enrollment to housing: 90 days!
- Client- Centered, Client- Choice

# ESHHC: Core Components

- Strategic partnerships
  - 8 Sub-grantees
  - Access to emergency shelter, housing programs, substance abuse/mental health treatment, etc.
- Fee for service model
  - Case Management
  - \$8.75 per 15 minute unit
  - Incentivize agencies to provide quality services to clients
- Universal/Coordinated Assessment
  - Centralized referral process
  - Universal assessment

# Community Results

- Prevention
  - 162 Households
  - 362 Persons
  - 127 children
  - 82% of households below 30% AMI
- Rapid Re-housing
  - 252 Households
  - 354 Persons
  - 62 children
  - 86% of households below 30% of AMI
