Breakout of FHFC Funding

- FHFC Funding Total: \$79.18 million
- At least \$47.51 million for SAIL
- \$15 million for Keys Workforce
- \$15 million for SAIL Workforce
- \$25,000 for study of early SAIL repayments
- \$1.647 million undesignated—FHFC Board will allocate

What's Happened since Last Thursday

- Originally, the House plan would only provide money for those cities and counties that had hurricane damage.
- The Housing Trust Fund money which has been appropriated will go out through the regular SAIL, SAIL Workforce and SHIP Programs, and the SHIP money will be allocated by the regular distribution formula.
- This mean that all counties will receive SHIP funds, as opposed to House plan that would only have made SHIP and SAIL available in counties with hurricane damage.
