- FEMA Director Brock Long has resigned- Deputy Administrator Peter Gaynor will take charge for now
- NLIHC hosted Research Collaboration Network to DC for meeting with Congressional staff and FEMA and HUD staff to discuss importance of data transparency and collection of demographically relevant data on vulnerable populations

Recovery Updates: Irma Rebuild Florida's Housing Repair and Replacement Program

- 10,972 registrants from more than 45 counties.
- 5,400 registrants in the most vulnerable population invited to apply.
- 2,180 registrants have started an application
- 1,119 registrants have completed their portion of the application.
