Where is the 2020-21 SHIP money?

- SHIP and SAIL were fully appropriated by the 2020 Legislature
- SHIP was line item vetoed by the Governor—the entire appropriation of \$225 million.
- This \$225 million in SHIP was not swept.
- It remains in the Sadowski Local Government Trust Fund
- To be appropriated! Or to be swept.....
- Our mission— and yes, we accept it, is to get that SHIP money appropriated for SHIP.

Campaign to Get SHIP Appropriation

- All Florida House and Senate candidates, including incumbents, up for election on November 3 have been invited to a free 30 minute webinar for an education on Sadowski funding. (includes Trey Price, Mark Hendrickson, and Senator Pruitt)
