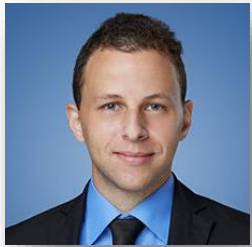

# Legislative Process

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- Session began **March 2, 2021.**
- **Session Week 4**
- Consideration of the appropriation of the state and local housing trust fund programs is underway.



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# Projected SHIP Estimates for FY 2021-22

- SHIP allocations based upon the Governor's Fiscal Year 2021-22 budget recommendation.
- SHIP distributions for 2021 could begin as early as July 1, 2021. Governor's proposed budget provides:

“Funds Specified above from each trust fund shall be transferred in four equal installments on a quarterly basis during the fiscal year, except funds from the Local Government Housing Trust Fund, **which shall transfer fifty percent by March 1, 2022 and fifty percent by June 30, 2022.**”

- This money is needed for households that cannot pay rent or make mortgage payments due to the COVID crisis and do not qualify for the restrictive federal assistance.
- Florida has the best housing programs in the nation to address the housing crisis.
- By using all the Sadowski fund for housing, Florida will:
  - Create 33,286 jobs;
  - Generate \$4,963,951,961 in total economic impact;
  - House 47,845 people;
  - Build, rehabilitate or sell 19,138 houses; and
  - Generate \$167,025,044 in revenue

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# Legislative Budget Update







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- First Base of the Budget Process: Initial Allocations
- The House and Senate will release their subcommittee allocations this week. The Senate is set to release allocations on Wednesday and the House on Thursday.
- The allocations will not factor in rising revenue projections or the Federal funding from the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021.
- That does not change the fact that the Legislature has the ability to plug a budget hole, if any, with the ARPA funds

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# How does the Legislature make appropriations?

- By passing a Budget Bill also known as the Appropriations Act
- There is no “housing bill” for appropriations
- There is an Appropriations Committee in the House and an Appropriations Committee in the Senate
- When the Senate and House Appropriations Committees agree on the amounts of money to allocate for the state and local housing programs (SAIL and SHIP, primarily), it becomes law (after signed by the Governor)

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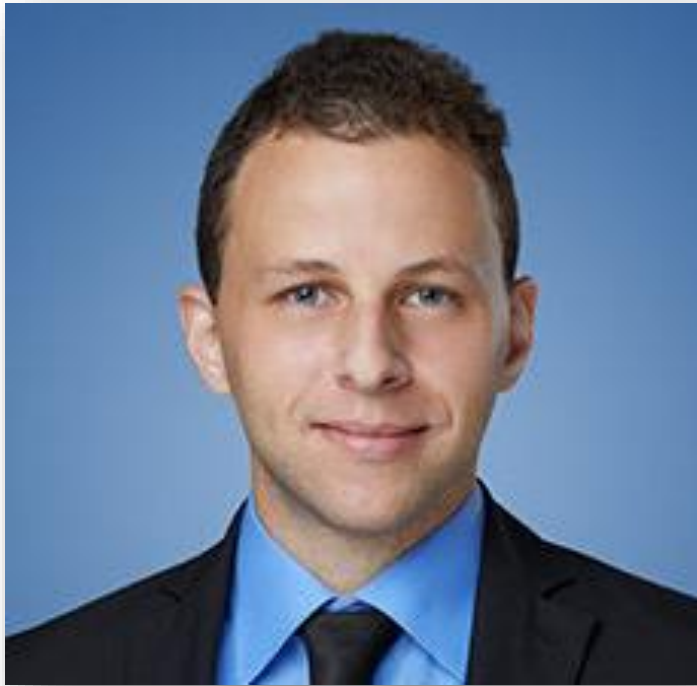

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# Additional Talking Points:

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- Not all housing funding is the same.
- Federal funds are vital to keeping Floridians stably housed during the pandemic, but they cannot replace SHIP.
- Federal funds keep renters & homeowners in their current housing, but SHIP is vital to building, preserving, and purchasing **new** housing.
- Homeownership: supply is down and prices are up – keeping many households out of first-time homeownership. SHIP is needed to provide down payment and closing cost assistance to create new first-time homeowners.
- Rental: SHIP is needed to provide gap financing for new multi-family developments to keep up with population growth and housing demand.
- With its tremendous economic impact, Sadowski Funds are fundamental to creating jobs, generating tax revenue, and rebuilding the economy post-COVID.

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# Emergency Preparedness & Response Fund

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- House Bill 1595 (Williamson)/Senate Bill 1892 (Diaz)
- Creates the Emergency Preparedness and Response Fund within the Executive Office of the Governor
- Fund intended as “primary funding source for the Governor for purposes of preparing or responding to an emergency”
- State can use this fund for immediate response and replenish the fund with reimbursements from FEMA, CDBG-DR, or other federal and state dollars
- Gov. DeSantis has proposed used \$1 billion in federal American Rescue Plan Act dollars towards this Fund

**As the dedicated disaster trust fund, this fund should be the first source of dollars to respond to disasters; eliminating the need to use Sadowski Housing Trust Funds while waiting for federal disaster funding, as in the Hurricane Michael example.**

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# Housing Bills Heard in Committee

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HB 13/SB 510

State Funds

(Rep. Killebrew/Sen. Hooper)

- Elevates the status of the Sadowski Housing Trust Funds; bars Legislature from sweeping unappropriated cash balances from the State and Local Government Housing Trust Funds
- Passed two committees in Senate; not heard in House

HB 423/SB 168

Hurricane Loss Mitigation Program

(Rep. Tuck/Sen. Hooper)

- Extends Hurricane Loss Mitigation Program (HLMP) to June 30, 2031
- In the Appropriations Committee of both Chambers

HB 55/SB 284

Building Design

(Rep. Overdorf/Sen. Perry)

- Preempts local governments from regulating building design elements for single & two-family homes with certain exceptions.
- Passed all committees in the House; second committee hearing today in Senate

HB 7019/SB 1954

Statewide Flooding and Sea Level Rise  
Resilience

(Rep. Busatta Cabrera/Sen. Rodriguez)

- Forms the Resident Florida Grant Program; requires DEP to complete a comprehensive statewide flood vulnerability and sea level rise assessment; & more
- “Affordable public housing” is defined as a “critical asset” that must be analyzed in sea level assessment and can be funded with grant dollars

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# Housing Bills *Not* Heard in Committee

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HB 567/SB 1068

Local Housing Assistance Plans  
(Rep. Bartleman/Sen. Taddeo)

- Makes changes to SHIP set-asides

HB 965/SB 1160

Florida Housing Finance Corporation  
(Rep. Roth/Sen. Rodriguez)

- Gives FHFC board the authority to make final determination on issuance of revenue bonds

HB 563/SB 674

Tax Exemption for Affordable Housing  
(Rep. Rodriguez/Sen. Rodriguez)

- Allows local governments to grant ad valorem tax exemptions for affordable housing developments

HB 499/SB 576

Prohibited Landlord Practices  
(Rep. Benjamin/Sen. Jones)

- Prohibits landlords from refusing to rent to a tenant solely based upon the tenant being previously evicted during COVID-19

HB 481/SB 412

Residential Evictions  
(Rep. Driskell/Sen. Rouson)

- Repeals Florida's "pay-to-play" Landlord/Tenant Statute

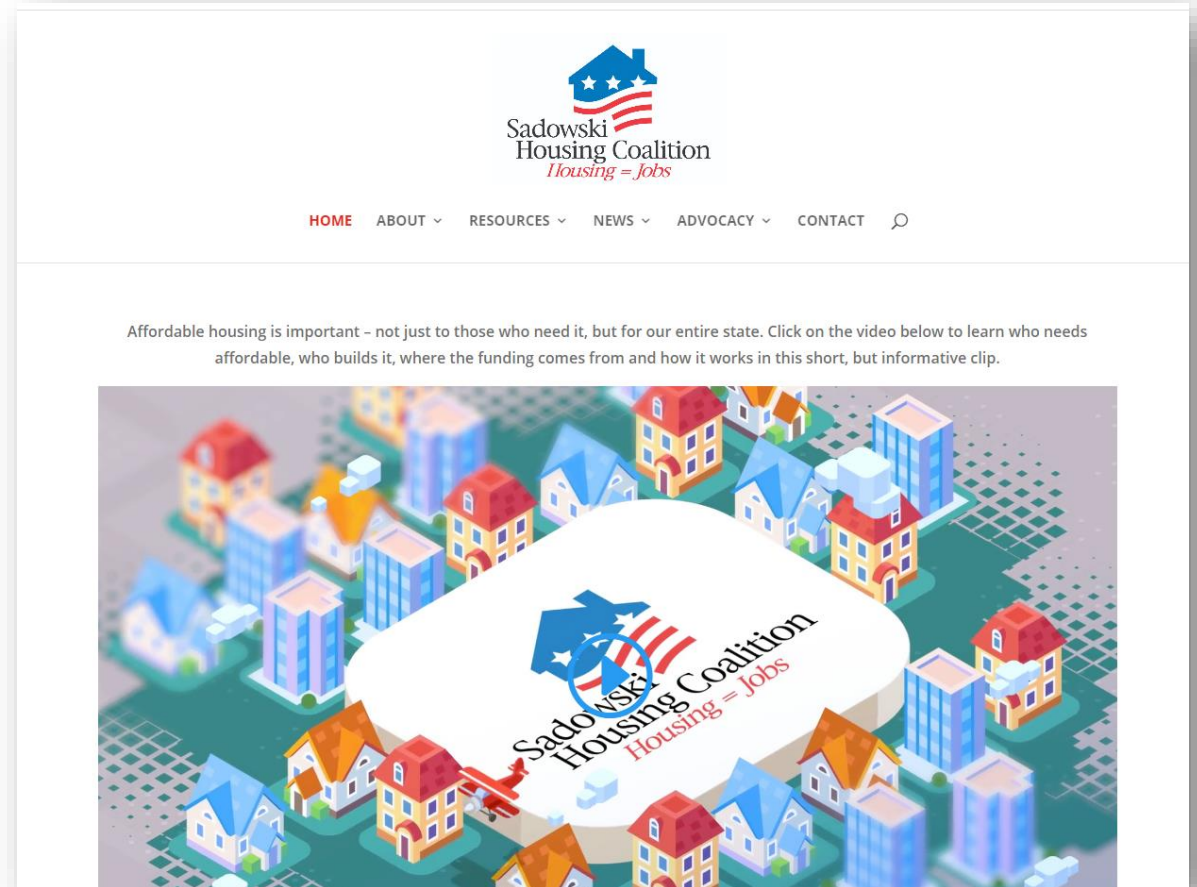
